Amnesty International has received reports that Carlos Eduardo Viver, Francisco Antonio Barraza and Norberto Huezo Martinez have been seen by relatives in the cavalry barracks of the 5th Regiment of Infantry (5 Regimiento de Infanteria). According to the reports, they were seen on 28 December 1981 and they are still being held illegally; no charges have been brought against them.

All three men were seized on 4 December 1981 by members of the combined security forces. They all worked for the El Salvador Human Rights Commission (Comisión de Derechos Humanos de El Salvador - CDHES), an independent human rights monitoring group which provides assistance to victims of human rights abuses and publicises their cases.

Further recommended action:

Please continue to send appeals on behalf of these three men. Urge that they be humanely treated while in detention and that they be immediately released unless charged and brought before a court of law.
