EL SALVADOR: 36 people abducted in San Antonio Abad 

Amnesty International has received reports that 36 people were abducted at a religious meeting of a Christian community in San Antonio Abad on 14 June 1981 by members of an unofficial pararailitary group. There it a strong reasons to believe that this group is acting with the complicity of the Salvadorian government. The present whereabouts of all 36 people are unknown and there is very serious concern for their safety while in the hands of their abductors. The 36 have been named as follows:

## Background information

Human rights violations on a massive scale in El Salvador continue to be brought to Amnesty International's attention. Armesty International is aware that these human rights violations have occurred at a time of escalating civil conflict between guerrilla groups and the Salvadorian authorities and AFso aware of reports of human rights violations having been committed by non-governmental forces. However, there is a systematic pattern of human rights violations, including torture, "disappearance" and cold-blooded murder, being carried out by the Salvadorian security forces, and directed against people who are not involved in guerrilla activities. Testimonies received by Annesty International implicate all branches of the Salvadorian security forces, whether nominally military, military police or paramilitary, in violations which have occurred on ... such a scale that they constitute a gross and consistent pattern of human rights abuses.

## RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Telegrams/express letters/letters expressing concern about the detention of these 36 people and urging that their physical safety be guaranteed. Please also request details of their place of detention and their legal situation.

Appeals from RELIGIOUS GROUPS in your country may be organized.

Do not make direct accusations and, unless otherwise instructed, do not use the word "torture".
