(1) On 4 April 1981 Manuel de Jesus Rodriguez Ruiz, aged 21, was abducted by agents of the National Guard in San Salvador. According to reports, he was blinfolded and taken away in a car.

It is believed that Sr. Rodriguez Ruiz has been acknowledged to be be in detention but it is not known where he is being held.

(2) On 9 April 1981 20 trade union leaders in the textile industry who were meeting in a factory in San Salvador were arrested by agents of the National Guard. Among those arrested were, Miguel Angel Azucena, Alejandro Carranza and Alfonso Reime Melendez.

Amnesty International has received no further news about the fate of these trade unionists.

Further recommended action:

Please continue to send appeals on behalf of Manuel de Jesus Rodriguez Ruiz and the 20 trade union leaders. Request clarification of their whereabouts and urge their release in the absence of charges and trial proceedings against them.
