Salvador Galileo Martinez Flores, Roberto Antonio Antillon Nunez, Joaquin Roberto Mendez Molino and Guillermo Padilla, all professors at the National University were abducted by agents of the Treasury Police (policia de hacienda) on 19 August 1982. Sr. Martinez Flores and Sr. Mendez Molino are both professors of chemistry; Sr. Antillon Nunez is a professor of physics.

The most recent information received by Ammesty International indicates that several other staff of the National University were abducted at the same time:

Francisco Américo MEJIAS LOPEZ, professor of physics Ana Elsy RIVERA IRULA, secretary at the university Santos Amadeo VASQUEZ, worker at the univeristy Mauricio Ernesto MARTINEZ RIVAS, worker at the university Oscar Romero CIENFUEGOS BANOS, worker at the university

According to reports, all these people were abducted in Pasaje Contreras, San Salvador, on 19 August 1982, while carrying out activities relating to their professions and work at the National University.

The present whereabouts of these people are unknown and fears for their safety continue.

Further recommended action:

Please send a further letter on behalf of these people requesting clarification of their whereabouts and legal situation and asking for assurances of their well-being. Urge that, unless charged and brought before a court, they be immediately released.
